REGULAR MEETING 1

The City Council of the City of Sherwood met for a regular meeting on August 26, 2013, at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Those present were Mayor Virginia R. Hillman, City Attorney Steve Cobb, City Clerk Angela Nicholson, Aldermen Brooks, Harmon, Lilly, McMinn, Butler, Heye, Keplinger and Sanders.

Jason Ferguson, Pastor of First Christian Church of Sherwood, led in prayer, and the Pledge of Allegiance was given to the flag.

Alderman Heye, seconded by Alderman Butler, made a motion, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on July 22, 2013, as transcribed. The roll call vote was unanimous.

Alderman Brooks, Chairman of the Advertising and Promotion Commission, stated the commission met in July for a combined July and August meeting.

Alderman Harmon, Chairman of the Parks and Recreation Committee, stated the committee did not meet in August. The next meeting will be September 9, 2013, at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center at 5:00 p.m.

Ordinance No. 2000, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE REZONING THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF EAST KIEHL AND BROCKINGTON ROAD FROM R-1 TO C-3 COMMERCIAL; AMENDING THE ZONING MAP; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES" was read. Alderman Brooks, seconded by Alderman Heye, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the second reading. The roll call vote was unanimous. The ordinance was read for the second time. Alderman Harmon, seconded by Alderman Heye, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the third and final reading. Alderman Harmon, seconded by Alderman Heye, made a motion to adopt the resolution. The roll call vote was unanimous.

Mayor Hillman announced that Sherwood Fest will be Saturday, September 21, 2013, from 8:00 a.m. to dark at Sherwood Forest at 1111 West Maryland. There will be a 5k, pancake breakfast and fireworks.
