REGULAR MEETING 1

The City Council of the City of Sherwood met for a regular meeting on July 27, 2015, at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Those present for roll call were Mayor Virginia R. Young, City Attorney Steve Cobb, City Clerk Angela Nicholson, Aldermen Brooks, Harmon, McMinn, Heye, Keplinger, Sanders and Williams. Alderman Lilly arrived at 7:05 p.m.

Hugh Yarborough, Pastor of Christian Assembly, led in prayer, and Star Scout Connor Keeler and Scout Noah Williams of Troop 770 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Alderman Brooks, seconded by Alderman Sanders, made a motion, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on June 22, 2015, as transcribed. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Alderman Lilly absent.

Mayor Young opened discussion for the June 2015 financials. No comments were made.

Mayor Young opened discussion for the 2013 Legislative Audit. Alderman McMinn asked if the findings have since been corrected. It was confirmed that they had.

Alderman Brooks, Chairman of the Advertising and Promotion Commission, stated the commission did not meet in July. The 4th of July Family Celebration was successful. Alderman Brooks thanked all of the volunteers. The next meeting will be August 5, 2015, at 3:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Alderman Harmon, Chairman of the Parks and Recreation Committee, stated the committee did meet. The committee took a tour of the 2nd floor of the recreation center to look at the new updated equipment. The next meeting will be August 10, 2015, at 5:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Alderman Sanders, Chairman of the Personnel Committee, stated the committee did meet. There will not be an August 2015 meeting.

A proposed ordinance entitled, *“An ordinance regulating the types of exterior wall surfaces visible from a public street in certain parts of Sherwood; declaring an emergency”* was read for the second time. Alderman Harmon, seconded by Alderman McMinn, made a motion to replace the ordinance with an ordinance with new language and for it to include in Section one I-1. The roll call vote was unanimous. Alderman Heye, seconded by Alderman Harmon, made a motion to strike “visible from a public street” in the heading and to add “re-adopted” in section 11. The roll call vote was 7 ayes. Alderman Williams no. Alderman Heye, seconded by Alderman Lilly, made a motion to strike Section 4 of the ordinance. The motion failed with a roll call vote of Aldermen Sanders, Keplinger, Harmon, Brooks, Williams, and McMinn no. Aldermen Lilly and Heye yes. **Ordinance No. 2074, entitled, “AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TYPES OF EXTERIOR WALL SURFACES VISIBLE FROM A PUBLIC STREET IN CERTAIN PARTS OF SHERWOOD; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY”** was read for the first time as amended. Alderman McMinn, seconded by Alderman Harmon, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the second reading as amended. The roll call vote was unanimous. The ordinance was read for the second time as amended. Alderman Harmon, seconded by Alderman McMinn, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the third and final reading as amended. The ordinance was read for the third time as amended. Alderman McMinn, seconded by Alderman Brooks, made a motion to adopt the ordinance as amended. The roll call vote was unanimous. The emergency clause passed with a unanimous roll call vote.

Ordinance No. 2075, entitled, “AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND MODIFYING ORDINANCE NO. 1669 REGARDING THE PERMITTING PROCEDURES FOR DOOR TO DOOR SOLICITATION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES” was read. Alderman Harmon, seconded by Alderman Brooks, made a motion to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on the second reading. The ordinance was read for the second time. Alderman Brooks, seconded by Alderman Heye, made a motion to suspend the

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rules and place the ordinance on the third and final reading. The roll call vote was unanimous. The ordinance was read for the third time. Alderman Harmon, seconded by Alderman Heye, made a motion to adopt the ordinance. The roll call vote was unanimous.

A proposed ordinance entitled, *“An ordinance to prohibit the parking of recreational vehicles in front of building lot lines in residential areas; providing for a penalty therefore; and for other purposes”* was read one time. Alderman Brooks added she would like to change the hour in section one from 24 hours to 72 hours. The following list of residents then spoke against the ordinance: Vanessa Beck, Richard Sanders, Richelle Crossland, Amanda Johnson, Carl Anthony, Dean and Vikki Erickson, Lane Septon, Dustin Daniel, Tim Wise, Mark Weber, Michael Melville, Jeff Johnson, Michael Sanders (not Alderman Sanders) and Michael Parrett. Richard Linsley spoke in reference to drainage issues he is having at his residence.

Mayor Young made the following announcement:
