

**July 25, 2016**

**REGULAR MEETING 1**

The City Council of the City of Sherwood met for a regular meeting on July 25, 2016, at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Those present were Mayor Virginia R. Young, City Attorney Steve Cobb, City Clerk Angela Nicholson, Aldermen Brooks, Harmon, Lilly, McMinn, Heye, Keplinger, Sanders and Williams.

Greg Clark, Pastor of Sylvan Hills Church of Christ, led in prayer, and the Pledge of Allegiance was given to the flag.

Alderman Brooks, seconded by Alderman Heye, made a motion, to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on June, 27, 2016, as transcribed. The roll call vote was unanimous.

Alderman Heye introduced members of the Sherwood Sharks swim team and announced they won the championship for the thirteenth year in a row. The team has approximately 270 kids on the team. Two members of the swim team advanced to the Olympic Trials.

Mayor Young opened discussion for the June 2016, financials. No discussion took place.

Alderman Brooks, Chairman of the Advertising and Promotion Commission, stated the commission did not meet. The family 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration was a success. The next meeting will be on August 3, 2016, at 3:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Alderman Harmon, Chairman of the Parks and Recreation Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The next meeting will be August 8, 2016, at 6:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Alderman Sanders, Chairman of the Personnel Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The next meeting will be August 4, 2016, at 5:00 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Alderman Lilly, Chairman of the Street Committee, stated the committee did not meet. The next meeting will be August 11, 2016, at 5:30 p.m. at the Bill Harmon Recreation Center.

Alderman Brooks inquired about the overlay for North Hills Boulevard and when Oakdale Road will be re-opened. Ellen Norvell, City Engineer, stated that the developer is developing the area and the road is set to re-open before school starts. Brian Galloway, Director of Public Works, stated that the overlay for the area of North Hills Boulevard is for the remainder of the road to the end of the Sherwood city limits. Alderman Heye inquired about Miller Road. Alderman Lilly stated that Miller Road has been tabled at this point.

Mayor Young made the following announcements:

Alderman Williams announced that the Sherwood Public Education Foundation Committee nominated two members, Shelby Thomas and Dr. Linda Remele, to represent Sherwood with the school district. Alderman Williams stated that both members will be on the November ballot for the first school board that the Pulaski County Special School District has had in the past five (5) years.

Mayor Young acknowledged and thanked the citizens of the Sherwood community for their outpouring support to the Sherwood Police Department in the last few weeks and wants the community and the police officers to know how much they are appreciated.
